Introduction

- Image Macros: multimodal constructions with text superimposed on an image (Zenner & Geeraerts, 2018; Dancygier & Vandelanotte, 2017)
 - we focus on memes with origin from known sources
 - we focus on viral memes that resulted in a meme template
- How do Internet memes change over time?
- we argue that memes evolve just like linguistic constructions, from iconic and concrete to abstract and grammatical

Grammaticalization

- Grammaticalization is a process of language change:
 - from lexical to grammatical
 - from concrete to abstract
- Stages of grammaticalization (Kuteva et al 2019:3):
 - extension: use in new contexts
 - semantic bleaching: loss in meaning content
 - decategorialization
 - erosion: phonetic reduction
 - possible renewal (Hopper & Traugott, 2003)



Abstract:

- Arbitrary in a diachronic sense: the relationship between the pictures, text, and the form of the meme is less and less motivated by the iconic meaning of the original source
- this arbitrary relationship (=grammar) needs to be acquired for a correct interpretation

- no knowledge of Star
 Wars is necessary to
 understand the meme






3.2. Text and its meaning change significantly

Grammaticalization vs. memes



Conclusion

- multimodal constructions also have a tendency to create abstract patterns over time
- viral memes evolve to become more abstract over time—in a process similar to grammaticalization

Conclusion

- multimodal constructions also have a tendency to create abstract patterns over time
- viral memes evolve to become more abstract over time

 in a process similar to grammaticalization
 - with every text and picture change they move further away from the original iconic meaning
 - viral memes become multimodal constructions with "grammatical" templates:
 - with different levels of abstraction, depending on the meme's structure and the complexity of the original iconic meaning
 - memes evolve in a cyclical way, but not all memes will give rise to a new meme
